Sometimes I'm called a story detective. As an author, I take events from my life and craft them into stories. I also search out stories in other people's lives as I write biographies.

My main goal during presentations is to empower students to find the stories in their lives. They can take everyday events and craft them into plots. They can develop characters with interesting traits. They can play with words and let their imaginations fly! I want students to come away from a visit feeling the magic of language, story, and imagination -- knowing that they are story detectives!

Thank you for considering me for a school visit. There is nothing I like more than to share my enthusiasm for books and writing with students. I would love the opportunity to work with you!



Presentations


Author Visits can be tailored to focus on either or both of these two new titles:





The visit will include a child-friendly exploration of world cultures and our connections with each other. How are we the same and how are we different? Breakfast varies from country to country, but it's how all children begin their day. Explore the meals of twelve countries in this playful approach to the world!

THE GIRL WHO NAMED PLUTO: The Story of Venetia Burney



The visit will have a STEAM focus, looking at how eleven-year-old Venetia Burney connected science and story and empowering students to know that they can do that too. When Venetia Burney's grandfather reads aloud from the newspaper about a new discovery—a "ninth major planet" that has yet to be named—her eleven-year-old mind starts whirring. "It might be called Pluto," she says. Grandfather loves the idea and contacts his friend who writes to scientists at the Lowell Observatory. After a vote, the scientists agree unanimously: Pluto is the perfect name for the dark, cold planet.

Presentations

As well as doing traditional author visits, assemblies, and keynotes, Alice's school workshops include:

A Story for Small Bear (Pre-K - Grade 1) ALSO OFFERED AS A VIRTUAL PROGRAM

Join Alice McGinty as she reads A Story for Small Bear (Small Bear puppet helps!), sings the interactive Small Bear song, and teaches participants a special "finishing song," so they can help Small Bear puppet transition from one activity to the next without dillies or dallies.

A No-dilly, No-dally, No Nagging, No Tantrum Bedtime

In an additional discussion with parents and teachers, Alice shares Mama Bear's Tips for Bedtime including the magic formula for motivation. She'll also discuss tips for helping children transition from one activity to the next.

Dig Deep Explorers (with The Sea Knows co-author, Alan Havis) (Pre-K - Grade 2)

Help young explorers learn to observe and explore the natural world around them (even in their own backyards), by starting with what they know and developing curiosity by asking questions which will help them reach wide and dig deep.

Catch The Rhythm

Using poetry, spoken language, books, and song, participants will catch the rhythm of language. We'll write it, draw it, move it, clap it, sing it and drum it! (Gr. K-3, wkshop or assembly)
(IL Goals 25.A.1c, 26.A.1d, 8.A.1a)

How Life Inspires Stories

How do authors take real life events and turn them into books? In this assembly, Alice will explain how authors turn life into story, how she has taken ideas from her life and developed them into books, and how students can create stories from events in their lives as well. Participants will develop their own group story and share several of Alice's books interactively using music and hand motions. (Gr. K-5 assembly – content will be adapted to fit age rangeof audience)

What's So Funny

From outrageous characters and silly situations to pure nonsense, we'll explore humor in writing and practice the skills you need to make your writing funny.

(Gr. 3-5, workshop or assembly)

The Stories Behind the Stories

Alice shares the stories behind her books, both fiction and nonfiction, and discusses the process of writing and publishing books.

(Middle and High School, workshop or Assembly) (IL Goals 2.A.3c, 2.A.4c, 27.A.3a)

Pop Goes The Button

In this program for Jewish Day Schools and Synagogues, Alice brings her book Rabbi Benjamin's Buttons to life with an interactive reading, along with props. This engaging, energetic program includes singing Pop, Goes the Button!, along with other group activities to encourage mitzvot and community. (Grades K - 5, and family programs).

Alice is happy to provide programming for any religious group focusing on community building and charity.

A Kindergarten Surprise

In this hands-on workshop, the author reads her books, Eliza's Kindergarten Surprise and Eliza's Kindergarten Pet. Students make a large "Mommy doll" during the assembly and classes will be given supplies for each student to make a Mommy doll later in the classroom.

Thank You, World – A Family Story Making Assembly

Hooray for books and stories! This energetic program introduces families to Alice and her books. Using multimedia and group activity, we read several of Alice's books, talk about story making, and put families to work together making stories. We'll sing songs, hear stories, create stories, and end by reading Thank you, World and making a school Thank you, World souvenir.

Preparing For Your Visit

Thank you for your interest in having me visit your school! Preparing the students ahead of time can help make the visit more meaningful for all of us and more educational for the students.

First, and most important, please have the students read at least one of my books. This will foster a much stronger connection during the visit! If you let me know which books the students have read, I can be sure to talk about them during the presentation.

Building Excitement

Next, you can help build excitement for the visit by having classes do projects with the books during the weeks before the visit. I LOVE to walk into the halls and classrooms of a school and have students and teachers show me the projects they've done, based on my books! I'm so impressed by the great work, and this type of preparation helps foster student engagement when I'm there. For activity ideas, you can look here (provide link) to find curriculum guides for several of my books.

Another way to prepare is to send home a flyer and book order form to parents several weeks in advance. If there is space available, parents can even be invited to attend the visit.

Space and Technical Needs

Presentations are normally 45 to 60 minutes in length – a 40 - 45 minute presentation followed by Q&A. Pre-K and K groups work best with 40 to 45 minute time slots.

Please schedule at least 15 minutes between presentations.

Please also provide a microphone (a lavalier is strongly preferred) and an 8 foot rectangular table at the front of the room for book display. For the "Catch the Rhythm" Assembly, a small white board and folding chair or stool is needed. For the other assemblies, please provide a digital projector and large screen.

Book Orders

First

The school can order them at a discount from the publishers, and then either sell them to students at the discount or sell them at full price and use the profits to help fund future assemblies.

Second

You can work with a local bookstore or order the books through IndieBound, Barnes and Noble, or Amazon. Give link to website with book ordering links.

Third

I can order the books for you. I give schools a \$2 discount from list price on each book. After you collect book orders and let me know numbers (I need numbers two weeks prior to the visit) I order the books and bring them with me on the day of the visit. Included in this packet is a book order form which you can distribute before my visit to students. If you are using a bookstore and not all the books on the form will be available for sale, you can adjust the form for your use.

I am happy to sign books! I can do this ahead of time or on the day of the visit. I'm also happy for teachers to bring in students who've ordered books in small groups on the day of the visit so they can see me sign their books.
